As the story unfolds, Dawn's two possible futures unspool side by side, as do the secrets and doubts long buried with them.

Dawn must confront the questions she's never truly asked: What does a life well lived look like? When we leave this earth, what do we leave behind? Do we make

choices . . . or do our choices make us? And who would you be if you hadn't turned out to be the person you are right now?
