Josephson argues that the invention of religion in Japan was a politically charged, boundary-drawing exercise that not only extensively reclassified

the inherited materials of Buddhism, Confucianism, and Shinto to lasting effect, but also reshaped, in subtle but significant ways, our own formulation of the concept of religion today.
