The Javanese text being published here is not appearing in print for the first time: more than half a century ago it was published by B.J.O. Schrieke in his doctor's thesis *Ret Boek van Bonang* ("The Book of Bonang") (1916). In Schrieke's work, however, the emphasis fell on the historical introduction to the text rather than on the text itself, the edition of which is free of shortcomings. Moreover, the analysis of the contents of the text appended to it could not make up for a complete
