English Prose (Taylor, Warner, Pintzuk & Beths 2003), the author proposes an analysis of OE adjectives by means of a theoretical apparatus couched in the framework of Chomsky's (TM) generative grammar. The analysis incorporates the following properties of OE adjectives: [their inflectional patterning, i.e. whether adjectives take a weak and a strong inflectional endings [the so-called adjective stacking, i.e. whether adjectives can occur in uninterrupted strings [the surface placement with respect to their complements [the surface placement with respect to the nominal head
The author observes that the differences

between prenominal and postnominal adjectives go far beyond the superficial difference in their surface placement. She argues therefore that the two types of adjectives require two different theoretical treatments. The volume consists of five chapters.
