Sally Rosen Kindred's third book, *Where the Wolf*, is a wood where a girl-turned-woman, a daughter-turned-mother, goes walking, searching for the warm fur, the hackles and hurts—past and future—inside her. These poems explore how stories—fairy tales, family memories, myths, and dreams—tell us, and let us tell each other, who we are, and what's wild and sacred in our connections. From "the beast your mother made/ who scans hood and bed," to the ghost-guard summoned by a child on the night her family fractures, to the teenage son who transforms into "beauty, his dread-body," the beings in these poems are themselves stories, spells: alchemized through
