Vygostky was Russian psychologist who died earlier at the age of 38, due to tuberculosis but he has written more than 100 articles and books, Vygostky's major work remained in Russian language (until its translations in 1960) but some of the translations are available now, Vygostky wrote about language and thought, cognitive and learning development, psychology of art and educating the students with special needs.
