Virginia Hall left her comfortable Baltimore roots in 1931 to follow a dream of becoming a Foreign Service Officer. She was soon deployed to occupied France where, if captured, imprisonment and torture at the hands of the Gestapo was all but assured. While there, she was responsible for killing 150 German soldiers and capturing 500 others.
