Led into Mystery is an unanticipated sequel to John de Gruchy's book *Being Human: Confessions of a Christian Humanist*. It was prompted by the untimely and tragic death of his eldest son, Steve, in February 2010, and the questions this posed about the meaning of life and death from the perspective of Christian faith. A further prompt came as a result of a multi-disciplinary research project on "the humanist imperative in South Africa" (2009-2010).
