 The present volume
 contains a large variety of
 treatment approaches to
 the long-term
 rehabilitation of the
 alcoholic, ranging from
 the biological to the
 physiological to the
 psychological to the

social. The multiplicity of
 proposed therapies, each
 of which has its strong
 proponents, suggests that
 alcoholism is either a
 complex medical-social
 disease syndrome
 requiring a multipronged
 treatment approach or a
 very simple illness for
 which we have not yet dis
 covered the remedy. The
 latter may, indeed, be
 true, but we cannot use
 what we do not know and
 must use what we do
 know. We do, however,
 have the obligation to be
 responsible in our
 treatment, to provide the
 best that is known at this
 time, and to be
 discriminating in our
 prescription of
 appropriate treat ment for
 individual patients. If
 there is one conclusion we
 would like to offer in our
 preface, it is that
 alcoholics constitute a
 markedly heterogeneous
 popula tion with widely
 disparate needs, for
 whom, at least at our
 present level of

knowledge, a broad
 spectrum of treatment
 modalities is necessary. If
 this is true, then probably
 most of this book has
 validity. With this volume
 on the treatment and
 rehabilitation of the
 chronic alco holic, we
 bring to completion our
 five-volume series, The
 Biology of Alcoholism. As
 the title of the present
 volume indicates, we
 have departed from our
 original intention to deal
 solely with biological
 aspects of the syndrome
 and have attempted
 rather to produce a more
 comprehensive work.

Teachers are constantly
 seeking ways to improve
 their teaching and
 thereby enhance the
 learning of their students.
 One method of doing this
 is to bring critical and
 creative thinking skills to
 the forefront of the
 curriculum. This has been

emphasized by the Malaysian Ministry of Education via the KBSM syllabus in order to teach critical and creative thinking by considering the use of programs like Bloom's taxonomy of educational objectives in classroom practice. This study demonstrates how the higher-order skills can be integrated into the secondary school reading curriculum. The main aim of the study is to investigate how teachers design reading comprehension questions (RCQs) and reading comprehension tasks (RCTs) in relation to the demands of higher-order thinking to produce students with critical minds. It focuses primarily on the use of COGAFF taxonomy (a cognitive-affective taxonomy adapted from Bloom's and Krathwohl's) to formulate higher-order reading questions and tasks as a means to develop critical and creative thinking skills. In a pilot study in Britain (with forty Malaysian teachers) and in the main field study in Malaysia, 150 subjects (teachers and student teachers) have yielded about one thousand RCQs and one thousand RCTs. In line with many research findings of question and

task design, 91.2% of the RCQs and 83.6% of RCTs produced during the pretest were of low-order types. Subjects attended a workshop emphasizing question and task designing using the COGAFF taxonomy. Dramatically, during the posttest, 74.4% of the RCQs and 80.6% of the RCTs were transformed into higher-order inferential forms. The other major thrust of the study is to demonstrate how higher-order questions can be used to design equally higher-order tasks that can be utilized as a thinking skills approach in the teaching of reading comprehension lessons in secondary schools. Thinking tools and strategies as suggested by Beyer, Guilford, Gardner, and several others and their implications for the teaching of reading comprehension and training of teachers in Malaysia are also discussed.

This is a book about the use of personal influence, protektzia, in Israel. All over the world, in both democratic and socialist societies, there exists some degree of recognition of the rights of citizens to complain about unjust treatment in organizational encounters. While the goals and actual functioning of complaint-handling devices may vary, bureaucratic role relations are ideally governed by the principles of universalism, specificity, and affective neutrality. In fact, patterns of actual behavior frequently differ dramatically from this model, giving rise to practices from bribery and embezzlement to nepotism, patronage, and

what is referred to in the United States as "pulling strings." In Israel, protektzia is widespread. This book is a major contribution to the systematic sociological study of this phenomenon. Drawing on the literature on the functioning of public administration around the world, Danet develops a theory about the conditions under which deviations from universalistic norms occur, distinguishing four patterns of organizational culture. The theory is then tested in a case study of bureaucratic encounters in Israel. The major focus is on understanding the processes involved in the comprehension of written text. Underlying most of the contributions is the assumption that skilled reading comprehension requires a coordination of text with context in a way that goes far beyond simply chaining together the meanings of a string of decoded words. If so, how? For example, did Nixon resign, before or after Billie Jean King beat Bobby Riggs? Originally published in 1977, little was known about the accuracy of temporal codes for memories, and still less about the nature of the codes. This volume addresses the central question of the mechanisms by which order information is attached to memories. The results of sixteen previously unpublished experiments indicate the

role of some independent variables on temporal coding in relatively short-term memory and in long-term memory. Several experiments, in which changes in proactive inhibition are used as an index of temporal differentiation, show that the nature of the words making up the lists is involved fundamentally in temporal coding. Other experiments demonstrate that in relatively short-term memory a subject cannot learn to improve his performance in estimating how far apart in time two events occurred. Still other experiments show that recency judgments for two events improve with practice, but the improvement is independent of the temporal separation. The context in which memories are established is shown to influence temporal codes only if an ordering metric is part of the context. The author advances several theoretical propositions to account for the various findings. In doing so he has given initial structuring for subsequent research to a neglected area. This volume will still be of significant interest to all those interested in learning and memory.
