Vers 1926, le cinéma sonore a d’abord été uniquement sonore. Quand on expérimenta les premiers synchronismes avec des microsillons, c’était uniquement avec de la musique. Ensuite, il y aura des chansons, de la musique et des paroles, d’où la formule qu’on voyait sur les affiches : " 100% sonore et parlant ! ". J’ai toujours connu et aimé la musique de cinéma. Quand j’étais enfant il y avait beaucoup de chansons dans les films français, chantées par Danièle Darrieux ou Jean Gabin et sont apparus les grands compositeurs. Maurice Joubert a été la première grande "plume" du cinéma français. Hélas, il fut tué dans les premiers jours de la guerre en 1939. Il avait écrit la magnifique musique de *L’Atalante* de Jean Vigo, la si jolie valse de *Carnet de bal* de Julien Duvivier... Whether talking about our individual tastes as listeners, or individual differences as performers, what are the psychological qualities that can turn some people into great musicians, but not others? Is it down to genes, sheer hard work, or some other quality in the individual? *The Natural Musician* is the story of how we become composers, performers, or just discriminating listeners. The third section deals with music education, looking at the role of innate and inherited characteristics in the formation of talent, and considering why many who excel at an early age, burn out later on. The book ends exploring how musical development can shape the human brain, strengthening other cognitive faculties, including those unrelated to music. This is a book that will fascinate anyone with an interest in music and musicians, from the fields of music psychology and education, to musicians themselves, whether amateur and professional.
