La Reina de Frederick Basic Books

Known for much of the nineteenth century as "the ever-faithful isle," Cuba did not earn its independence from Spain until 1898, long after most American colonies had achieved emancipation from European rule. In this groundbreaking history, David Sartorius explores the relationship between political allegiance and race in nineteenth-century Cuba. Challenging assumptions that loyalty to the Spanish empire was the exclusive province of the white Cuban elite, he examines the free and enslaved people of African descent who actively supported colonialism. By claiming loyalty, many black and mulatto Cubans attained some degree of social mobility, legal freedom, and political inclusion in a world where hierarchy and inequality were the fundamental lineaments of colonial subjectivity. Sartorius explores Cuba's battlefields, plantations, and meeting halls to consider the goals and limits of loyalty. In the process, he makes a bold call for fresh

perspectives on imperial ideologies of race and on the rich political history of the African diaspora.

Não obstante esta ser uma instituição recente, se comparada à temporalidade das outras instituições que compõem o Ministério da Defesa no Brasil, a ESG também se caracteriza como uma das mais complexas, pois sua concepção diversa possibilita análises por abordagens, ângulos e campos do conhecimento distintos. Esta tese procura evidenciar a influência maçônica presente na prática pedagógica e simbólica da Escola Superior de Guerra, especialmente no período 1949-1961, marcado pela sua formação e da construção de suas bases pedagógico-filosóficas, principalmente pela ação do Almirante Benjamin Sodré.

Pretende-se elucidar a maneira pela qual esta instituição, conhecida pela denominação "Escola", foi sendo organizada ao longo dos seus primeiros anos, constituindo-se como um espaço de sociabilidade e convergência entre civis e militares no intuito de manter uma esfera pública de debates, orientando-se por influenciar e resolver entraves em assuntos governamentais.

An incisive new look at the black diaspora, examining the true roots of antiblackness and its destructive effects on all of society. Thanks to movements like Black Lives Matter, Western society's chronic discrimination against black individuals has become front-page news. Yet, there is little awareness of the systemic factors that make such a distinct form of dehumanization possible. In both the United States and Brazil—two leading nations of the black diaspora—a very necessary acknowledgment of black suffering is nonetheless undercut by denial of the pervasive antiblackness that still exists throughout these societies. In *The Denial of Antiblackness*, João H. Costa Vargas examines how antiblackness affects society as a whole through analyses of recent protests against police killings of black individuals in both the United States and Brazil, as well as the everyday dynamics of incarceration, residential segregation, and poverty. Ultimately, he asks why the denial of antiblackness persists, whom this narrative serves, and what political realities it makes possible.
